Language Codes

Windows 95 and NT have a standard definition for languages that Keyman 4 integrates with. Each language is given a code (shown in the table below), and dialects of this language are given sub-codes. The standard defined languages are shown below; for other, undefined languages, either use a new sub-language code in an existing, related language, or use the user-defined language codes x200 to x3ff and sub-language codes x20 through x3f.

User-defined language codes

If you decide to use a user-defined code, you can request a unique code for your language at <http://www.tavultesoft.com/keyman/langcode/>. Tavultesoft will then keep track of the languages by assigning codes to ensure that Keyman keyboards will not conflict with each other. If you do not plan to use the keyboard in conjunction with any others, or to distribute it to other people, it is safe to use any language code you wish.
