

Typing in Gurage

The Amharic keyboard (ગ) provides *only* the letters used in Amharic. It uses a system whereby the Amharic sounds are matched to the English letters (a style called “phonetic”). You can think of how a word sounds in Amharic and then type it out with English.

Example: typing **selam** becomes ስላም

Because Gurage has more sounds than English does, we sometimes have to adjust this rule. For example, English does not have ‘ኝ’ and the closest similar letter would be ‘c’. In this case you should type with “Capital C”:

Example: typing **enCerebie** becomes እንጂሪብ

Notice that we needed both “ie” together to make the 5th ‘ለ’ letter ‘ኩ’. When the letter you want to type does not appear when you hit the similar sounding key in English, try using the capital next. If typing the capital does not work, then try hitting the key followed by a “y”:

Example: typing **yetgyekyere** becomes የትግኝሬ

Example: typing **qyes** becomes ቁስ

Next, when you need to type the extra letters of Gurage like ‘ኩ’, ‘ኣ’, ‘ኩ’ you can do so by typing an extra vowel after a ‘u’:

Example: typing **mua** becomes ሙአ

Example: typing **pue** becomes ሙይ

Finally, we must introduce a special rule for ' (apostrophe). Some words are spelt with a አያስ (6th) letter followed by a vowel, like **ርክ** in **የበርክዎ**. We use the apostrophe here to type “gebr[']iel” to make sure we get “ርክ” instead of ‘ክ’.

Example: typing **mel'ak** becomes ሙልአክ

Example: typing **m'Eraf** becomes ሙዳራፍ

If an apostrophe, ', is needed after a አያስ letter in your document, type it twice like:

Example: k" to produce ክ'

The following typing tables show how to type all Amharic letters, numbers, and punctuation.

Consonant and Vowel Marks

Dots can be added above letters to indicate a stressed vowel or consonant using “CTRL + . ”. For example:

አብ CTRL . ⇒ አብ (“abaa”, “a” is stressed)

አብ CTRL . ⇒ አብ (“abba”, “b” is stressed)

አብ CTRL . ⇒ አብ (“abbaa”, “b” and “a” are stressed)

Typing Punctuation

Ethiopic Punctuation

Period, ‘.’ may also be used to enter ‘#’. When a number follows ‘:’, ‘:’ and ‘#’ they will change back to their Latin form automatically. For example:

123:456 ⇒ 123,456

12#:50 ⇒ 12.50

12:50 ⇒ 12:50

Keyboard Punctuation

All regular punctuation on your keyboard remains available. Most punctuation can be typed with a single keystroke as usual. Those used to input Ethiopic symbols can be entered by hitting the punctuation key two or more times until it appears.

Typing Numbers

The hash mark is used Ge'ez numbers, so #1 becomes ከ and so on. When a ‘#’ is needed before a number in your document, just type # twice.

Ethiopic Numerals
